Finding Your Roots Online

The Mary Lou Griffin local History Collection is pleased to present a four part series on the theme of Internet Genealogy. The volume of genealogical data that has been posted online (by individuals and government agencies) over the last few years has been extraordinary. Transcriptions of first source records are increasingly available on the internet as are digital copies of such sources. Twenty years ago, you would have to go to the Public Record Office in London to view your great grandfather's birth registration; now you can view it online and in some cases, access is free. Today we can find online genealogical sources under such headings as: adoption, forums, heraldry, immigration, military, obituaries, organizations, reunions, surnames, list-serves etc. The Library's Internet Genealogy series will explore government sources, commercial fee-based databases, Google and the Latter Day Saints FamilySearch website. All sessions will be at Richmond Hill Central Library, Meeting Room A. Admission is \$5.00 per session. Interested persons are asked to pre-register at the Central Library's Full Service Desk.
